Vicar's letter . . .

Dear Friends,



There is a common phrase that 'life is a journey and not a destination'. No single person is accredited with this phrase, but it is an interesting one to consider. This is especially so this month as we remember those that have gone before us, and particularly those who have given their life in wars, conflicts and in the name of a cause they held dear.

As we grow, learn and develop, we are influenced and moulded by those around us, and those that we have known who preceded us. With Remembrance Day on the 9th November, we think particularly of those called to serve in the armed forces and who have made the ultimate sacrifice so that others may be free from tyranny. We also remember loved ones at our memorial service on the 2nd November, for their part in making us the person that we are today.

So, yes indeed, life is a journey because it inevitably involves twists and turns, sometimes even a dead end and the need to start again. Life holds good days and sometimes more difficult times, and there is quite often the feeling that life is simply not fair.

We may be surprised to reflect upon the life that God lived through Jesus: seen as illegitimate, a refugee, with few possessions, no worldly wealth, ridiculed, abused, mistreated and killed. And yet we read that 'God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him [Jesus] should not perish but have eternal life.' (John 3:16)

Jesus was a gift, a considered and willing offering from God to the people he loves. God gave everything for us, and did so to show that a relationship with God is possible and an eternal home the reward. Life is, therefore, not only a journey, but also a destination. As we come to Remembrance, let us consider what we have learned from those who have lived and died, and how the amazing love of God influences our life and future.





Why did we have a Prayer Tent by the Church in September?

A Prayer Movement, started by a student in 1999, grew exponentially as groups all over the world caught the vision; and now, over two decades later, thousands of communities hold regular prayer events.

In September this year a Global Week of Prayer was organised. Here in Wonersh we decided to join in. A specific 'vision' was given of a simple tent on the grass near the church door. So that is what we did.

I visited the tent twice during the week, and the experiences could hardly have been more different. The first occasion was late on a fine afternoon, the churchyard was still, and there was absolute quiet. This gave me a chance to focus on some of the many wonderful and thoughtful resources provided. It was interesting to see just how many stickers had already been placed on the world map, indicating places and situations that others had already prayed about.



The next time was much busier. I arrived to find two other members of the church already there, so it was lovely to join them for a few minutes. After they had gone I was joined by a couple from the village, who described themselves as occasional worshippers at St John's. Finally, as I was leaving, another couple of ladies (unknown to me) were arriving, and a couple of dog walkers were looking to see what it was all about. The mere fact of having the tent outside had clearly spoken volumes.



Do come and enjoy your memories, share some silence and give thanks to a loving, ever-present God who upholds us through the good times and the difficult.











Meet Andrew Quaintance and his Blackheath Recollections

56 years ago I came to live in Blackheath; apparently this qualifies me to indulge in some reminiscences about the village and what it was like back then.

Few people outside the village seemed to know of its existence or what it offered, except perhaps for the pub (properly called The Volunteer for sound historical reasons) or the Cricket Club. The village felt more remote

and secluded than it does now, and had an air of distinctive difference. In appearance the village was more open; fewer trees and bushes and hedges in gardens, and the surrounding trees had not grown to their present size and maturity. Some cottage gardens were given over to growing vegetables, and the allotments at the exit from the village were actively worked. As my neighbour was heard to mutter when he saw marigolds being planted in my garden: "Flowers, flowers, what is the use of flowers? You can't eat flowers."

The village scene was not dominated by cars. The first car that I can recall being regularly parked on the road was outside Pine Cottages. Parking on the grass verges was prohibited and this ruling was enforced for many years. Occasionally the local policeman, known as Blenkinsop Wonersh, would appear on his bicycle; and the Lord of the Manor, Sir Edwin Herbert, lived in the village and took an interest in village matters.

When Sir Edwin was ennobled as Lord Tangley, and his coat of arms was being devised, he received an inquiry from the College of Arms about his choice of the figures for the two supporters of the shield. He replied that the supporters should be a badger and a deer, because these were his closest neighbours. Unusual, but he had his wish. Thankfully we still have both.

Visitors' cars in the top car park, which was a great deal smaller than it is now, were fewer and infrequent. The people who lived in Tarsia Cottage kept all manner of animals and fowl, including dogs, goats, ducks and hens, which roamed freely or were tethered in that corner of the heath and car park. Their existence seems to have been untroubled by the few cars that came and went and they survived without mishap. Littleford Lane car park did not exist.

The village shop and Post Office was beside the church, and on a Saturday morning it was a good place to meet other villagers. Outside was the public telephone box which was regularly used by those who did not have a phone in the house (I'm talking landlines here). My first house did have a phone, but it was on a shared line with the house across the road. Since my neighbour over the road was a correspondent on the Financial Times the telephone line might be engaged for frustratingly long periods.

I have rambled my way to the bottom of the page, so now I must stop.

The Mills of Wonersh



Many will be aware that Wonersh had a water-powered mill (sometimes called Lower Mill) located on the west side of the Cranleigh Road, near Lostiford House. The Grade II listed Water Mill is now a much-changed residential home built into the side of the dam which created the millpond. It stands close to, but apart from, the rather grand, also Grade II listed, Mill House, parts of which are said to date to the late C14th.

The Water Mill, thought to be Tudor in origin, but with C18th and C19th additions, was used for grinding flour on three pairs of millstones. Two of the millstones had been removed at some stage and there was some speculation that Gertrude Jekyll may have been responsible. The first documented reference to this mill was on a map dated 1676 when it was described as a corn mill. The source of its power was an overshot water wheel. In the late C19th, the wheel, which was of cast iron, was advertised for sale as it had been replaced by a turbine.

What is probably less well-known is that Wonersh had a second mill, just a few hundred yards to the north-east, on the other side of the Cranleigh Road. That mill

(sometimes referred to as the Upper Mill) was a leather-dressing or fulling mill used for making saddles, straps, garments etc. It seems not to have been a full tannery such as that at nearby Gosden. This Mill was also water-powered. This 1871 map (credit: National Library of Scotland) shows the proximity of both mills. It was not uncommon for corn mills and fulling mills to be found close together, sometimes in the same building. As if to reinforce that connection, we are aware that in about 1885 Wonersh Corn Mill was leased for 21 years to Messrs Pullman, the owners of Wonersh Leather Mill, at a rent of £180 p.a.





We have no photographs of the Leather (Upper) Mill, but we have an image of a building that was adjacent to the Cranleigh Road, opposite Lostiford. This building was described as a chamois leather factory.

There are few visible remains near the site of the Leather Mill, but the former millpond remains and a stepped water feature close to the driveway to Derryswood takes the mill stream under the driveway.
